Attractions Introduction :	<p>Keelung City</p> <p>Keelung, a 40-minute drive northeast of Taipei, is one of Taiwan's international seaports and transportation hubs. The statue of Goddess of Mercy is the landmark of Chung Cheng Park in Keelung. It is the biggest Goddess statue in Southeast Asia. Inside the statue is a stairway leading to the top where you can have a panoramic view of Keelung Harbour. The first immigrants to Taiwan used to fight for land. In order to stop the disputes, they set up a temple in the Park for yearly worship. The ground in front of Chu Pu Tan is where worshipers gather on Chung Yuan (Ghost) Festival which falls on the 15th in July of the Chinese Lunar calendar</p> 
	<p>Yehliu Scenery</p> <p>Yehliu is a 1.7-kilometer-long cape that juts into the sea, where wave erosion, weathering, and the action of the earth's crust have combined to create sea-eroded trenches, candlestick rocks, mushroom rocks, bean curd rocks, beehive rocks, potholes, dissolved basins, and all sorts of other fantastic rock formations. Among the most spectacular and famous results of erosion here are those named Queen's Head Rock, Fairy Shoe, and Candlestick Rock.</p>
